FOUNDER'S MESSAGE



Dear Readers,

Cervical cancer tops the list of women's cancer in India while breast cancer follows it as being the second most common cancer especially among urban populations. Around 1.4 lakh Indian women die annually from these two cancers. These cancers have been on the rise especially in the developing countries like India due to cultural inhibitions and lack of awareness among women about timely screening and treatment, besides the absence of concerted large-scale screening drives in such countries.

The importance of community screening programmes could be judged from the fact that these cancers are preventable if pre-cancerous abnormalities are identified timely and proper treatment is provided, thus saving scores of lives. In our attempt to operationalize such community screening of cancer for early detection of suspect cases, several camps have been conducted by us with support of various corporate houses and interested individuals.

One such camp was conducted on 4th February 2015 at PHC, Hayatpur, Gurgaon with Financial Support of DLF Foundation, to commemorate the World Cancer Day. The beneficiaries of this camp were the women of this village who were screened for cervical and breast cancers using simple primary methods of screening that do not require any laboratory infrastructure. A follow-up of suspect cases was also done.

Commemorating World Cancer Day, 4th February 2015

Community Sensitization on Women's Cancers and Primary Screening of Women for Detecting Abnormalities in Cervix and Breast

A Camp Conducted by World Healthal Trust with Financial Support of DLF Foundation

(Venue: Primary Health Centre (PHC), Hayatpur, Gurgaon)

World Healthal Trust's focal area since its inception has been the prevention of women's cancers in India. To prevent the high occurrence of these cancers among rural women, several community awareness programmes and screening health camps have been conducted. One such camp was conducted in the Primary Health Centre (PHC), Hayatpur, Gurgaon on World Cancer Day, 4th February 2015 with financial support of DLF Foundation. WHT team comprising the

Founder-President & CEO, Scientists and Support Staff along with two Gynecologists and a Nurse were present at the camp. The aim was to educate people about the four women's cancers, particularly cervical and breast cancers, and to encourage their prevention, detection, and early treatment. A day prior to the camp, World Healthal Trust had already distributed 2000 pamphlets and several banners were put up in the near-by areas of Hayatpur village to promote maximum participation for the event.

A public awareness/advocacy programme for about 60 women was organized in the Primary Health Centre (PHC), where Dr. Chawla addressed the gathering and sensitized women about the prevalence of the four women's cancers in our country, their risk factors and symptoms associated with each of the cancers and the importance of early screening and timely treatment. Specially designed easy-to-understand leaflets (in Hindi) on all the four women's cancers were also distributed among the audience. All queries of the general public related to the four women's cancers were also addressed by Dr. Chawla along with the gynecologist, Dr. Reeta and Dr. Pinki.

After the advocacy round, the women were requested to register themselves for getting screened for cervical and breast cancers. The screening of cervical cancer was done by Visual Inspection with Acetic Acid (VIA) method for the detection of pre-cancerous lesions in the cervix, which turn aceto-white by the application of freshly prepared 3-5% acetic acid to the cervix area. For breast cancer detection, the screening method used was breast physical examination (BPE) by expert gynecologists.

The dignitaries present during the camp included Er Anuj Sinha (Former Director, Vigyan Prasar), Dr. P. K. Goswami (Senior Technical Advisor, Institute for Global Development, IGD) and Mr. Kuldeep Singh (Programme Manager, IGD), Dr Reena Sinha (Gynecologist, Medical Officer, PHC) and Preeti (Pharmacist, PHC). Dr. P. Cheena Chawla, Founder President & CEO, World Healthal Trust extended a warm welcome to all present on the occasion and acknowledged the support of DLF Foundation, Gurgaon for conducting this camp.

While addressing the gathering, Er. Anuj Sinha appreciated the concept of conducting such community camps as proper knowledge about the disease and early detection can save many lives from cancer. He congratulated World Healthal Trust for taking this initiative. Dr. Reena Sinha, Medical Superintendent, PHC shed light on the importance of this camp and requested the participating women to get themselves screened for breast and cervical cancers. Dr.

Goswami expressed his heartfelt appreciation for the efforts of World Healthal Trust and extended his good wishes for the future progress of this initiative.

RESULTS OF SCREENING

A total of 30 women were screened during the camp for detecting any signs of both cervical cancer and breast cancer. In this group of screened women, eight women showed aceto-white lesions that were visually observed on the application of 5% acetic acid on cervix region. They were in the age group of 30-50 years and were recommended to get the Pap smear test done. Eight women having abnormalities were referred for ultrasound test of pelvic region and one was recommended endometrial biopsy. Out of the 30 women screened for breast cancer, one case was observed to be positive for early signs of breast cancer and was recommended for mammography. The follow-up of the suspect cases was done.
